Foreword

The 4th international Conference on Economics and Social Sciences (ICESS) was organized by the Bucharest University of Economic Studies between 10th and 11th June 2021.

The online edition with the topic *Resilience and Economic Intelligence through Digitalization and Big Data Analytics* was *inspired* by the effects of the health and economic crisis generated by the COVID-19 pandemic. The new economic crisis is considered an important and unprecedented experience in the business world with considerable impact on education, and particularly on university life. The world is changing and new business models will be considered by the most innovative and intelligent people and companies. Resilience and reshape, restart and rebuild are the key words in the new economic revolution. The revolution is related to business, but mostly to intelligence and learning. Virtual and online systems are not a modern solution anymore, but the normal way of functioning. The new business world is driven by digitalization and big data analytics.

The papers selected for online presentation and published in the conference proceedings are an important portfolio of outcomes and solutions for post-crisis challenges and dilemmas, as they propose solutions of how competition will work in digital markets with an emphasis on market power, concentration and data protection; they deal with defining actions and alternative options toward resilient cities, conditions and means of concept implementation, and accountability of urban planning, reflecting the importance of resilience given the limited organizational resources as well as the narrow short-term perspective, in connection with a digital transformation mindset and initiatives based on use of intelligent technologies.

The papers with international co-authorship are an important pillar of research internationalization. ICESS is not only an international conference, but also an international forum for debate, a research platform, and a very important tool for dissemination of research and more importantly, a very useful learning experience for the PhD candidates of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies and of other partner institutions.

The authors and co-authors of this edition presented 164 papers, and more than 35 participants came from 11 different countries: Brunei, Bulgaria, China, the Czech Republic, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Italy, Poland and Serbia.

We are committed to support publication opportunities for the conference participants. The partnership with the international publishing house Degruyter/Sciendo will support the proceedings volume publication and further indexation in the main international databases offering more transparency, visibility and international exposure.

One of the most important university and conference partners is Sapienza University of Rome, Italy, a reliable academic partner, supporting teaching and research activities, especially papers with international co-authorship. This year, the PhD workshop with EM Strasbourg from France "Branding and Training Talented Researchers for New Entrepreneurial and Digital Society" was a part of the ICESS conference. The workshop was intended to foster doctoral collaborative research, exchange of ideas and networking among PhD candidates from different fields.

The university life and research have always been supported by businesses and the social community, as business partners have been highly involved in the student life of the university, but also in the research activity. She has doctoral degrees from Oxford University and the Bucharest University of Economic Studies. Her research explores a wide range of business and society topics, including market-place exclusion, rural health, food poverty, artisanal mining, volunteering, sustainability, and post-disaster reconstruction, using participatory creative methodologies of stakeholder engagement and knowledge coproduction. The example of professor Kelemen is a proof that excellence is a reality and ASE could represent a starting point for a top quality research and teaching career in Romania or in other international university aboard.
